FROM THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES CHAIR KELLEY HUGHES

MVUUF Highlights 2018-2019

For 2018-19 at MVUUF, a full year it has been.

We installed Rev. Laura Thompson as our lead minister of MVUUF.

We ordained our first-ever Minister of Congregational Programs, Rev. Andrea Johnson.

We, as a community, are processing the upcoming retirement of longtime member and Minister of Music, Sonia Johnston. We thank her for her music, and celebrate her service on Sunday, June 9 at 10:30 AM.

We hired staff to support MVUUF's mission and vision, and we have benefited from their support: Kate Stomberg; Nicole Collins, and Sara Sweeney.

We have increased our community outreach. Mark your calendars: MVUUF is a National Night Out site on August 6, 2019.

We have also implemented an online and phone system so that those of us who want to stand in solidarity on the front lines of activism can be notified quickly and efficiently for last minute opportunities. If you are not yet a part of this system, please contact any Social Justice Committee member, including KJ Hummer, Kate Grande, Rev. Andrea, or Rev. Laura.

We continue our technological upgrades, to increase accessibility to our Sunday services and to information about MVUUF's activities.

The 21st Century has brought increasing gun violence, disproportionately targeted at religious groups and at schools. Rev. Laura has initiated the development of an emergency response team. Rev. Laura reports that she, Jason Marshall, Nancy Buckman, Dale Lewellyn and David Olson have attended an armed-intruder workshop in May, sponsored by MVUUF's insurance provider, Church Mutual. Per Rev. Laura, "Pat Chelmo and Judith Anderson are also part of this group. The group plans to meet in the summer to update an emergency procedures manual to include that information, alongside weather, fire, medical and other possible emergencies. The new manual will be rolled out this fall, and will include training for hospitality teams, RE teachers, the Board of Trustees, and others who are interested. The roll-out will also include scheduled drills for the whole congregation. MVUUF is committed to being prepared for emergencies and to keep all of our congregants and visitors as safe as possible." Thank you, Reverend Laura and her team, for this important work.

We updated our long range plan, which has goals based on the evolution of MVUUF. The Board, who owns this plan, will review it quarterly, and will make recommendations for updates annually.

Nancy Buckman and Doug Bruce, the Chair and co-Chair of the 2019-2020 Board of Trustees, respectively, have been researching options for the neighboring property that the Hanifl Foundation kindly acquired for MVUUF. Nancy and Bruce have met with Bloomington leadership about these plans. More coming in 2019-2020.

The MVUUF Board of Trustees meets next on Wednesday, June 12, 2019. It's always an open meeting, so all are welcome to attend. If you have an agenda item, please email me directly at uukelley@hotmail.com, before Wednesday, June 5, so I can assure it is included on the June agenda. Thank you!

Religious Education Teacher Recruitment - Please consider volunteering for this vital role in our church community.

Our model is a cooperative one, with families learning and growing in religious community together. We depend on one another to create a vibrant experience for all ages! Each family is asked to support the program by volunteering in one of the following ways during the church year:

- Classroom Teacher (PreK 6th Grade) Teach 8 Sundays during the church year. Training, complete session plans, prepared materials, and staff support are provided.
- Nursery Volunteer (babies age 3 years old) Volunteer in the Nursery 8 Sundays during the church year.
- Coming of Age/High School mentor (accompany youth as they create their statement of faith - meet approximately 4 times during the church year)
- Choice Sunday Volunteer (help kids with interactive activities in the Social Hall one Sunday a month)
- Chaperone/driver for Youth Events and Overnight Retreats (7th-12th grade)
- Family Night Volunteer (help with dinner clean-up, supervise kids crafts and games)

This year we are asking that all teachers wishing to teach next year, sign up now so that we can have one orientation at the beginning of the year. Your teaching teams can decide amongst you how you will divide up the year. There are 16 Sundays to split amongst your



team. If you want to each only in the fall or spring that is okay or if you'd prefer to teach less often but all year that is okay too. We are asking for 5-6 volunteers for each classroom so that the work-load can be spread across the teaching team.

June brings the end of the 2018 – 2019 church year. This was the first year we were able to disperse some of the fund. We established a process to grant funds and produced a grant request form. Committees were informed that grants were available for projects not funded by the normal operating budget. Two grants were proposed and approved by the Endowment Committee and the Board of Trustees.

One grant was used for registration fees for "Courageous Faith Revolution Training." It is a two year staff/ lay leader training program to explore new ways of understanding faith formation and family ministries. We are already seeing new things happening for families. For instance "Saturday Movies and Pizza" and "Family Night & Community Concert."

The second grant was for "An Afternoon at the Opera." This brought a new musical experience for our membership and was promoted to the Opera's list and in the Bloomington Sun Current. Attendance was about 80 people.

The committee worked extensively with Kate in the office to get our files on the MVUUF computer. In addition, we spoke with members about legacy giving and memorial contributions.

Our current Chair, Glenn Corliss, and committee member Marv Gish are leaving the committee this year. Thanks for all your work. We look forward to welcoming two new members next year.


