SUMMER SUNDAY SERVICES 10:30 AM

July 7th, 10:30am: What is Worth Fighting For? With Independence Day upon us, our thoughts often turn those things that worth fighting for; life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness. As a community, we have the ability to fight for these things on a larger scale. This service will be a very engaged dialogue about what things we, as a community, might come together to fight for. Together, we'll outline some goals to pass on to the Social Action Committee for things we might work on next year and look for other ways to build support for the issues that are most important to us.

July 14th: What a Trip; Psychedelics; Our guest, Christopher Gunluck will speak to the growing role of psychedelics and alternative medicine as our society seeks to heal itself. He will explore the history of psychedelic medicine, how they were banned in the United States, and the growing body of research that shows their tremendous potential for emotional and spiritual healing. Christopher recently completed his master's degree in alternative healing arts. Polly Sonifer and Mark Lofgren will be co-leading the service.

July 21st: <u>A Case for Religious Naturalism</u>; The concept combines a naturalist worldview with perceptions and values commonly associated with religions. What. Can this approach offer us and how can it bring meaning to our lives? Rev. Andrea Johnson, music TBA.

July 28th: I Love You Just the Way You Are: Beautiful Bodies, Part 1; Too often our own body image prevents us from the radical self-love we need to ground ourselves in, that we might truly be able to radically love others. What are the roots of not loving ourselves and how do we break the cycles they generate? Rev. Laura Thompson and Linda Hayen, music TBA.

Aug. 4th: <u>I Love You Just the Way You Are: Measures of Success</u>; Our culture plays a large part in dictating models of success. Aug. 11th: I Love You Just the Way You Are: Beautiful Bodies, Part 2; Folks with disabled bodies or differently abled bodies face discrimination and challenging obstacles every day. 


EVENING BOOK GROUP


