January: Intention

"Here's what I discovered. Intention is different from setting goals or resolutions in that it "pulls us into" who we truly are. Goals and resolutions "push us out" into future possibilities. To set intentions, we must listen to our inner voice which tells us who we truly are."

So here we are again, in the month of January, with its talk of daring resolutions and demanding calls to become better. It's hard to resist. After all, who of us couldn't benefit from a bit of self-improvement? And so most of us gladly go along and declare "This is the year I'm finally going to be a better me!"

But are we sure this is what we really want? When you read that quote above about being "pulled in" rather than "pushed out," what happens in your heart? Is being pushed really what you want and need? Are you really excited about the New Year's work of striving to create a brand new

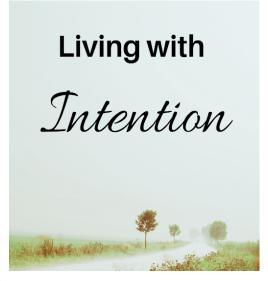
you? Or do you suddenly notice an internal whisper that says, "I long to be pulled in more deeply to the self I already am"? In other words, maybe our real New Year's work is not about pushing forward into self-improvement, but about pausing, stepping back and asking, "What hunger has my heart?"

There is, after all, a big difference between becoming better and becoming ourselves. Self-improvement is not the same as self-alignment. Wanting to get from point A to point B is something quite different from longing to find your inner anchor. Bottom line: Goals and intentions may indeed be more distinct than we have thought. And being clear about that may be more important than we have thought.

So this month, maybe our most meaningful work is to make room. All around us this month, there's going to be tons of talk about creating goals and imagining who we might become. But living with intention seems to be more about creating a quiet space that allows us to connect with who we already are, a space that protects us from the pressure to accomplish and instead makes room to ask questions of integrity.

And if we are able to carve out that quieter space, then maybe we will discover that this isn't the year of "finally becoming a better me." Maybe we'll decide it's enough to simply "finally be me."

COVID Update

It is strongly recommended that attendees who are eligible for the Covid-19 vaccine are vaccinated fully and boosted, if they are also eligible for that.

If you have experienced any sign of illness in the days before an MVUUF in-person gathering, please do not attend in-person.

If you have a positive test in the few days following an in-person gathering at MVUUF, please let us know as soon as possible, that we might alert others who may have been exposed.

Expectations and standards for in-person gatherings:

- Air filtration systems have been updated throughout the building.
- Masks are required to be worn at all times, unless speaking from the pulpit.
- Anyone speaking unmasked from the pulpit must be vaccinated.
- The sanctuary is currently set-up with more spacious seating (only 65 seats instead of 130). There are also chairs in the upper lobby for viewing. It is recommended to leave a chair empty between you (or you and your spouse/family) and other attendees.
- All staff are fully vaccinated.
- Singing may be limited for the time being, until restrictions around it loosen.
- All choir members, ushers/greeters/tech and other folks with a role in the Sunday Service are expected to be vaccinated
- There will be no food and beverage available to eat on after the service.

Children and Youth Programming

Programming for children under 12 will be an all-together weekly gathering in the Social Hall, until we deem we have enough children involved to separate into classrooms again.

All volunteers in Children, Youth and Family programs are required to be vaccinated.

In December our theme was Joy: The children and youth especially enjoyed making these lego creations as a

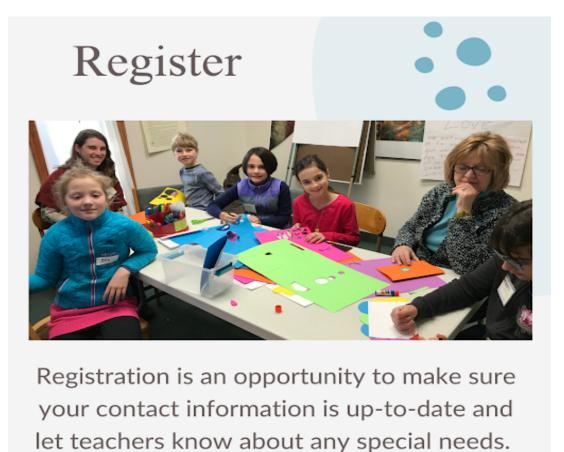
way to explore being open to joy this season.

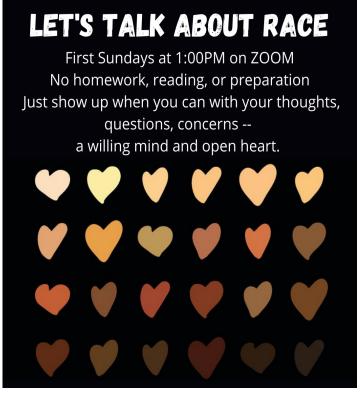

Raise the Roof; A Fundraiser for Housing

In Minnesota, there is critical need for housing particularly for extremely low-income renters, or renter house-



holds that earn at or under 30% of area median income (AMI). There are approximately 169,585 renter households in the state that fall into this category; yet, there are only 64,238 affordable and available units at this income level across the state. This leaves a gap of 105,347 units needed for extremely low-income renters.

This month, we'll explore the housing crisis in Minnesota and pool our resources together to benefit our housing partners this year: Beacon Interfaith Housing Collaborative, BLUU Housing Initiative, and OASIS for Homeless Youth. Speakers representing these organizations will be joining us throughout the month.

We invite you to be generous in your giving as we come together to address this urgent crisis. You can donate on our website, using the Vanco Mobile app or end donations by check with the memo "Raise the Roof" in the memo. All donations from the Christmas Eve service will go towards this cause, as well.

A Balancing Act

Usually in the course of our fiscal year, income is received in a predictable way. We can rely on pledges, which comprises the vast majority of our income being paid in three ways: 1) Early and all at once; 2) A consistent monthly amount; and 3) Late with lots of reminders.

This year is different. Since our 2021-22 Stewardship campaign in March of 2021, 12 members passed away, and 24 others have moved or chosen not to pledge for personal reasons. We are meeting in person again, through hybrid services, and we are hopeful that some new visitors will pledge. That said, COVID-19 and other issues have reduced our pledge units by 36, and our pledge dollars by \$34,000. As a result, our predicted income is reduced by \$40,000. This means our income and expenses are out of balance.

Just like a teeter totter, the heaviest is at the bottom.

Not all of us have deep pockets, or even pockets to begin with. For those of us who do have pocket room, even a little, if each of us reaches into those pockets, it will help bring us back into balance. The teeter will no longer totter.
