December 2023: The Gift of Mystery

Welcome to the Gift of Mystery

We live in a culture that loves to conquer mysteries. For us modern folks, the unexplainable is simply a lock to be picked, a code to be cracked, a puzzle to be figured out. But what if mystery isn't just something to solve? What if it's also something to be listened to?

This is the lesser recognized call of our faith. "Yes," it says, "Stay skeptical, continue to question and seek answers. But at the same time, leave space for life to speak!" One of the most elegant articulations of this comes from the poet Mary Oliver. In her beloved poem, Wild Geese.

Oliver's call to listen for life's mysterious announcements implies a letting go. Mystery is funny this way. You can't make it speak. Indeed, often the more you pursue the meaning of life's mysteries; the more distant it becomes.

Whoever you are, no matter how lonely,
the world offers itself to your imagination,
calls to you like the wild geese, harsh and exciting
over and over announcing your place
in the family of things. -Mary Oliver

If we want mystery to speak, it seems we have to be willing to put down the pursuit and open ourselves to being caught off guard. UU humanist minister and poet, David Breeden, captures this beautifully.

Slipping, and then falling into the sky. Is there a better way to describe our dance with mystery? Isn't this what all the great mystics have been trying to tell us from the start? That sitting at the heart of mystery is not the unknown, but unity. We fall into the mysterious oneness of life and then it falls into us. Its

voice whispers, "I am you and you are me." Simply put, mystery doesn't put up barriers; it dissolves them. Haven't all of us faced the wonder and mystery of a sunset, the stars, a baby's first cry or a lover's wet kiss and thought to ourselves, "My God, who I am does not end at the barrier of my skin!"

And it's not just words of connectedness, but comfort too. We find ourselves crushed by the weight of the world, so we take a walk in the woods, watch the waves kindly caress the shore, stare into the night sky or stumble on the smile of a stranger. And often, but not always, we hear the world gently sing, "It will be ok. In fact, it is all already ok!" have fluttered to your feet.

So friends, this month, let's let mystery work its magic. Let's allow ourselves to fall in and be opened up. Let's slip into the sky and let it slip into us. Let's set the sleuthing down, for just a moment, and simply listen. We can't wait to hear what the world whispers back.

On piles of dust rising
Then once
At midnight
I slipped
And fell into the sky


The Writing as Spiritual Exploration November class was so lovely. We read fabulous poems, delved into intriguing discussions, and wrote our own reflections based on prompts and poems we'd read. I was so inspired by the depth of the writings and discussions as well as participants' willingness to be present and brave in their exploration. If you are curious about the poems and prose we read, please let me know and I will email you a packet.

The next Writing as Spiritual Exploration will be in January. The date is yet to be determined. The theme for January is Liberating Love. That sounds like a juicy topic to read and write about. I look forward to those discussions. The workshop is hybrid, but I encourage attendees to come in person if possible.

Even though I use the Soul Matters' themes, the WASE curriculum is completely my own. So if you do a Soul Matters group you won't find this redundant. Also, even though I am poet, we read both poetry and prose and participants write in whatever form they are most comfortable.

I always break the 1.5 workshop into 2-3 sections to look at the theme from different angles. There are 2-3 writing examples from reflective, inspiring poets/writers for each section. This will gives a rich foundation for in-class writing. I have prompts and suggested exercises for each section too. Where attendees choose to wander with these suggestions/prompts is open. Sharing is optional but WASE participants in the past have found it meaningful in digging deeper into the theme.

For example: Coloring can be a fantastic spiritual practice! As you color, try letting yourself relax into the repetitive movements as a form of moving meditation, rest in the beauty of the colors, or focus on the smell and feel of the coloring tools you have chosen. Any craft material can become a tool for spiritual practice, if you set your intention that way. For example, as you bend and twist and create art with pipe cleaners, try focusing on how the material feels against your fingers. Let your movements be repetitive or free flowing.

Winter Retreat


Our Stewardship Team is planning a winter retreat to include massages, a possible sound bath, and possible gourmet food. Stay tuned!



The Evening Book Group usually meets on the third Thursday of the month throughout the year at 7 PM.




