#### **OWL**

Our Whole Lives is honest, accurate information about sexuality that dismantles stereotypes and assumptions, builds self-acceptance and self-esteem, fosters healthy relationships, improves decision making and has the potential to save lives. OWL for 4-6th graders is age-appropriate, fun and builds community. It is a 10 session program running from the end of September through the middle of December. My colleagues who have lifespan OWL programs in their congregations attest that having this honest, accurate education offered at younger ages supports the 7-9th grade OWL program. MVUUF has offered 7-9th Grade OWL in the past, every three years. The Board of Trustees, the Elementary-Aged OWL Facilitator Team and Rev. Laura support beginning an OWL program for 4-6th graders. Again this year, Music Sunday and the MVUUF Service Auction will be one wonderful event on April 21st.



## Endowment where the manage from what is the proof.

You may be wondering about the endowment fund- where the money comes from, what is the process to decide how the money is spent and how has the money been spent recently?

The endowment fund is NOT spent on budgeted operations like salaries and office supplies. It is available, upon request, for special projects that benefit the congregation. There is a form that is completed by the sponsor and turned over to the endowment committee who read it, get clarification as needed, then passes it onto the Board of Trustees for final approval. It is the responsibility of the sponsor or the sponsoring committee to schedule the event, complete the necessary paperwork, advertise the event, recruit any necessary helpers, clean up, to basically run the event.

The current fund has been financed through legacy gifts from individuals and financial tributes usually given at a memorial service in sympathy cards or via information in obituaries. Please consider including MVUUF in your legacy plans, your will or beneficiary assignments. Inform your family of your wish to complete your current year pledge commitment and to donate a gift and/or memorials to the MVUUF endowment fund or to specific projects/programs such as the music committee or OWL or Soul Matters.

The endowment committee has drafted <u>a sample letter</u> you could use to communicate your wishes to your family.

The money is currently invested by the UUA, along with endowment funds from other UU congregations.

Before the COVID pandemic threw everything into disarray, the endowment fund had funded a musical evening with Opera students and some staff training.

If you have an idea or a project you think would benefit our community you can talk to a committee member or ask our Administrator for an endowment fund form.






