## Practicing Resistance

Of all of our themes this year, resistance is among the most complex, but it also may be the most simple.

Let's start with the complexity. Sometimes resistance involves bravely picking up a picket sign; other times it asks us to courageously put down our masks and allow who we really are to see the light of day. Sometimes it involves defeating the enemy; other times it's a matter of noticing that treating "them" as the enemy defeats us all. Often the path of resistance asks us to stay in it for the long haul, but just as often it's about taking that first tiny step. Most of the time it requires us to fight to the bitter end, and yet there are many moments when we need to stop resisting and let go. Resistance certainly takes the form of speaking the truth to power, but often what the world needs even more is for us to speak the truth in love. Bottom line: practicing resistance is tricky business and takes multiple, even contradictory, forms.

There is, however, one nearly universal truth about resistance: it's most powerful when done together. The power of our picket sign is amplified when it is one of hundreds or thousands. Being who we are usually begins with another person loving us for who we are. Both the long haul and our first courageous step are made possible by reaching out to receive a helping hand.

It's all one big reminder that none of us have to do the work of resistance alone.

Yes, we certainly need to be pushed and prodded this month. But maybe what we need most is to be reassured. Reassured that when the road gets too treacherous and the forces against us grow too big, others will be by our side. Maybe it's not more courage that is required, but more connection. Maybe what we really need to hear is not simply "Resist!" but "I will resist with you!"

Maybe it is as simple as that.




### *Every year, each day*

### More to Recycle at MVUUF!

We are making a difference with Ridwell. It's wonderful that so many people are taking advantage of this premium recycling service. December pickups are the 14th and 28th. Please have your recycling sorted properly by January 13th and 27th



**The featured item in January will be holiday lights. Now you don't need to throw broken or antiquated string lights. This category included rope lights, icicle lights, clear and colored string light. They can be broken or working. Bring your unused holiday lights to MVUUF and recycle them with Ridwell.**



MVUUF members and friends can recycle the following: multi-layer plastics, batteries, light bulbs, **plastic 6-pack rings, plastic bottle caps, prescription bottles, cords and cables.** Please be sure your items are clean and that your batteries are not corroded. Place items in the appropriate bag inside the box on the lost and found shelf by the front door. Additional information about what can be included is on the front label of the box. Thank you for helping MVUUF make a difference!

**Remember plastic** film goes in the bins on the outside by the front doors. Linda Hayen takes them to a different recycling service where they can be transformed into park benches.
